Synopsis

Nevere is the brightest young witch at Spellwright School for Wizardry, she's got her best friend Taolo, a slightly annoying familiar Cletus, and her loving-if-out-of-touch mom--so why does she feel like something is really wrong? After a school assembly about the dangers of love potions, Nevere snatches her professor's spell book, just a week before the Spring Fling. While giving someone else a love potion may be kinda dicey, what if you could make a love potion . . . for yourself?

NEVERE'S LOVE POTION is a musical about consent, mental health, and the bravery it takes to ask for help.

From the Dramaturg

Before a play can live on the page or on the stage, it must first grow through a process of development. Workshops, edits, readings, and rehearsals shape a new script into something ready to be shared. As soon as a play enters this stage of growth, the playwright begins to hand the story over to collaborators: dramaturgs, actors, designers, and directors. These individuals leave their mark on the world of the play, weaving their discoveries into its fabric. A first cast and creative team make an indelible imprint, one that can echo long into the future, even shaping what eventually makes its way into publication. A joke improvised by an actor, a blocking idea from a director, or a question raised by a dramaturg can shift the trajectory of a character, a relationship, or even the story itself.


Nevere's Love Potion has been living in this kind of process with the performers you are about to see. Over the past few weeks, they have done far more than learn lines, staging, and music. Through writing exercises, improvisations, and collaborative discussions, they have created lore, backstory, and emotional depth for these characters that now pulses within the play. Each rehearsal brought new discoveries, each choice deepening what this story could become. What you see today is not only the playwright's work, but also the collective artistry of the first group of creators who brought Nevere's Love Potion to life. As part of their process, the actors wrote diary entries from the perspectives of Nevere and Taolo. They also wrote things their characters might want to say to each other but cannot. We are including some of these excerpts here to give you a window into the discoveries that shaped the story you are about to see.

"I came home and me and Cletus made a huge mess playing around with potion ingredients. He doesn't know a newt's eye from dragon's pus, I swear."

"Dear Diary, you know Nevere? The girl I want to be friends with? We sat together at lunch . . And we talked, I guess? Is it dumb writing in a diary? Is it girly? I don't know . . . But I have a lot to say. I went home today. The same 3 mile walk. I got inside and dad wasn't there. He didn't come home till 11 pm. Dinner, I skipped. Kami (my cat) he brought me a dead mouse . . . hope it wasn't my neighbor's familiar. Anyway . . . that made dad angry . . . so at 11 pm I had to clean it up . . . I told him about Nevere. He said it was stupid to only be friends with a woman."

"I don't know why, but even with an A+ in potions I feel like I could do better. Maybe it's just me wanting to be different from my mom. I love her, but being a teacher's daughter can be a bit much."

"I wish I had the energy everyone else does. Sometimes it feels like the world is moving around me, and I can't catch up. All I can do is just sit and wait for it to slow down."

"anyway my mom invited Nevere over for dinner tonight, we're having fried pegasus and frog feet! Chocolate popping phoenix claws, my favorite! And hers too apparently. I hope I was able to make her feel better with the candy, and that dinner will cheer her up, too. It's funny (or not funny, I guess, but interesting . . .) because I always thought Nevere was so cool! And she is! But I was so intimidated by her. Maybe she needs a friend as much as I do."

"Today wasn't bad. Nevere's still angsty, but I ran into gym shorts guy. I recently learned his name is Raoul. I tried starting conversation but he doesn't seem to like talking about anything that isn't broomball. Kamil was in gym today too, which is shocking because he's been out sick all week. I guess that's what happens when your family is anti-vax."

"I've had so much going on inside my own head and a million "I'm sorry's" couldn't cover up how much I've neglected your friendship these past months. I didn't even tell Cletus how much I've been struggling. All this time I've wanted so badly to talk to you but I kept thinking "If I can't understand myself, how could he?"

"I'm scared, worried. I don't want to lose her. I won't have anyone else. If it was me? If I did something, I'll fix it however I can. And if she really wants me gone? I'll leave. All I want is for her to be happy. For her to smile when it's not a fake one. Or to hear her laugh. She's been quiet. She acts like I haven't noticed, but I have."

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
